THINGS TO KNOW



COURTEOUS

DO be courteous of others using the park. The public may continue to use the park and restrooms during your reservation.



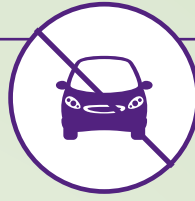
CLEAN UP

DO clean and vacate the shelter by the end of scheduled reservation time. Parks close at 10 pm.



NO GLASS

DO NOT bring glass beverage containers into parks.



NO VEHICLES

DO NOT drive or park on the grass or bike paths. Parking is restricted to marked stalls in parking lots.



NO WEAPONS

DO NOT bring weapons into the park shelters and restrooms.

Shelter reservation is valid only for the time noted on your receipt. Shelter use outside of this time inhibits the ability of park staff to complete scheduled cleaning/maintenance.

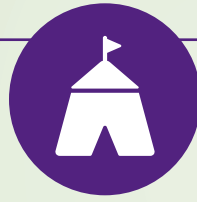
Park improvements may be occurring during your reservation, but are scheduled around reservations whenever possible.

PERMITS



PUBLIC AMPLIFICATION

Permit REQUIRED for sound amplification. Permits have a 6-hour limit and CANNOT exceed 9 pm.



TEMPORARY STRUCTURE

Permit REQUIRED for structures larger than 10'x10', including inflatables. Dunk tanks, sprinklers or other water features are NOT ALLOWED.



ALCOHOL

Permit REQUIRED to have alcohol in select parks. No glass containers. Sale of alcohol requires a separate permit from the City Clerk's Office.



VENDING

Permit REQUIRED to sell anything in the park.

A minimum of 10 days' notice is required for Park Permits.

Shelter Reservation Policies

- **Park hours:** 4 AM - 10 PM. No one may be in the park during closed hours.
- **Shelter hours:** Locked shelters may only be accessed during reservation hours. Enclosed shelters may be accessed only during reservation hours. Use of locked shelter before or after reservation hours will result in additional fees. Open-air shelters may be used on a first-come, first-served basis when not reserved, but use of the shelter is guaranteed only during reserved times.
- **Parking:** Driving or parking motorized vehicles on the grass is prohibited. You may only temporarily unload or load a vehicle at the shelter. Violators may be ticketed and/or towed. There is a 3-hour parking limit at some parks. Reservations will be offered parking passes where needed for the duration shelter is reserved.
- **Park Amenities:** Restrooms remain available to the public during reservations or until the reservation end-time (if reserved). The athletic and play areas can be used on a first-come, first-served basis unless they have been reserved -- please limit use to one hour at a time if another group is waiting.
- **Picnic tables:** Tables will be inside or within the vicinity of the shelter. Picnic tables may be chained together. If you move any tables, you must return them to their original positions at the end of your reservation.
- **Prohibited in shelters/parks:** Glass containers (see City Ordinance MGO 8.24(3)), fasteners other than painter's tape, balloons, and water features (including dunk tanks, sprinklers, and water balloons).
- **Pets/Animals:** Pets (dogs, cats, etc.) are not allowed in shelters.
- **Clean up:** All reservation facilities are equipped with trash containers (and recycling containers from Memorial to Labor Day). You are responsible for clean up and must leave the shelter in a clean and presentable manner.
- **Permits:** Must be purchased at least ten (10) business days before your reservation.
 - **Public Amplification (P.A.) permit:** Required for sound amplification (i.e. a band or DJ). P.A. permits have a 6-hour limit and are not to exceed 9 PM. Direct all amplification away from residential areas.
 - **Temporary Structure permit:** Required for any structure (with the exception of one 10' X 10' tent), including tents, stages, bouncy houses, inflatables, etc. Inflatables must be [Wis. Admin. Code § SRS 334](#) certified. You must call Diggers Hotline 10-14 days before your event so they can mark utilities.
 - **Alcohol permit:** Required to have alcohol in alcohol free parks. Alcohol must be contained within the shelter and the immediate surrounding area. All glass containers are prohibited. Alcohol free parks: cityofmadison.com/parks/reserve/shelters/permits.cfm
- **Park improvements:** Access to amenities may be limited during the time of your reservation. Please visit cityofmadison.com/parks/projects for more information.
- **Vending:** Prohibited without additional Special Event permitting. Please visit cityofmadison.com/specialevents for more information.
- **Key(s):** Keys are required for some amenities, but the customer does not need to pick up a key if they are not using that amenity.

Cancelation and Changes

- **Cancelation deadlines:** Submit in writing to parks@cityofmadison.com or 330 East Lakeside Street, Madison, WI 53715.
 - **Reservations made opening day** are not eligible for a full refund; a 50% refund will be issued if canceled 11 or more days prior to the event.
 - **Full Refunds:** 28 days or more prior to the event, will include a \$25 service fee.
 - **Partial Refunds:** 27 to 11 days prior to the event.
 - **No Refunds:** 10 days or less before the event.
- **Undesirable Weather:** No refunds.
- **Date/time/location changes:** Must be received 28+ days before the event date, will include a \$25 service fee.

Additional Fees

The following fees will be charged upon violation of parks rules/rental policies:

- **Key Service:** \$60 if a Park Ranger is called to unlock an amenity due to a failure to obtain a key.
- **Keys lost or not returned within two (2) business days of reservation:** \$50/key.
- **Failure to vacate park:** \$75 per every half-hour the park is not vacated after reserved time.
- **Failure to obtain required permit(s):** \$25 + permit fee.
- **Clean-up/Damage Fees:** \$50 per hour. One-hour minimum + material costs, if needed.

BRITTINGHAM PARK

Brittingham Park is near downtown, along Monona Bay. The reservable shelter is near the intersection of West Washington Avenue and Park Street. The first parcels of this park site were acquired in 1903 and the remaining lands were secured either by purchase or donation. Designed by Landscape Architect O.C. Simonds, the development of the park site was spurred by a substantial gift in 1904 by Thomas Evans Brittingham.

SHELTER KEYS

Keys may be picked up at 330 East Lakeside Street as early as three (3) business days before your reservation. The Parks Office is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. Keys must be returned to the Parks Office within two (2) business days of the reservation to avoid additional fees.

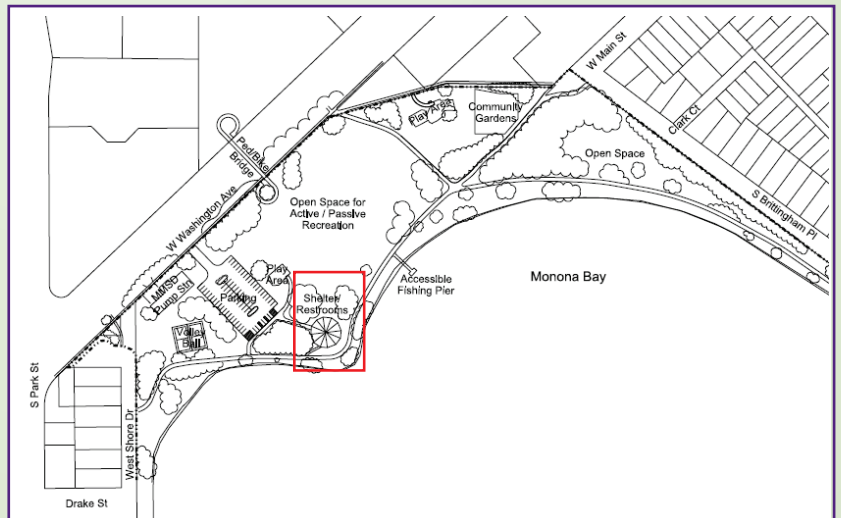

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BURROWS PARK

Burrows Park is on the shore of Lake Mendota, near where Fordem Avenue runs into North Sherman Avenue close to Maple Bluff. The land was bequeathed to the Madison Park and Pleasure Association in 1909 by one of its active members, George B. Burrows (1832-1909), who also served as state senator and Assemblyperson from Madison.

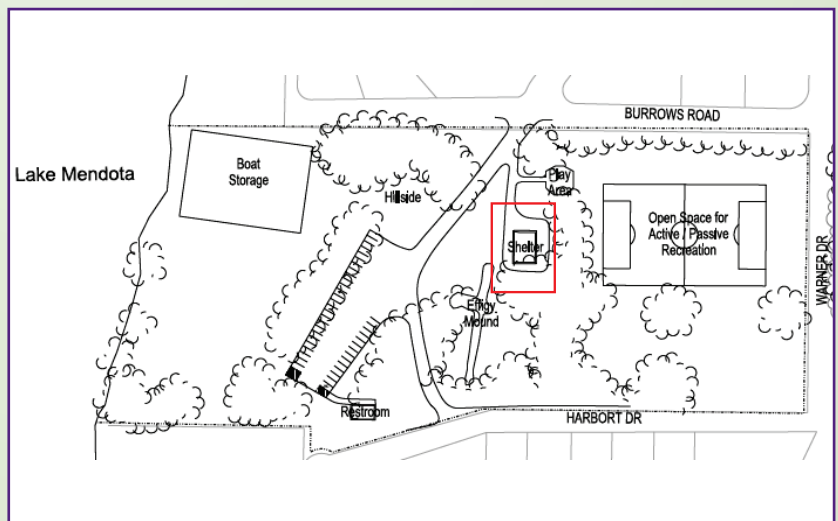

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DEMETRAL PARK

Demetral Park is located on the east side, near Kraft Oscar Mayer and East High School. Born in Greece, Jimmy Demetral (1895-1978) came to America in 1912 as a young man and barnstormed the country as a wrestler, later winning the world middleweight title in 1928, and the lightweight title in 1930. For 45 consecutive years he promoted an annual wrestling benefit in Madison to raise money for underprivileged and disabled youngsters.

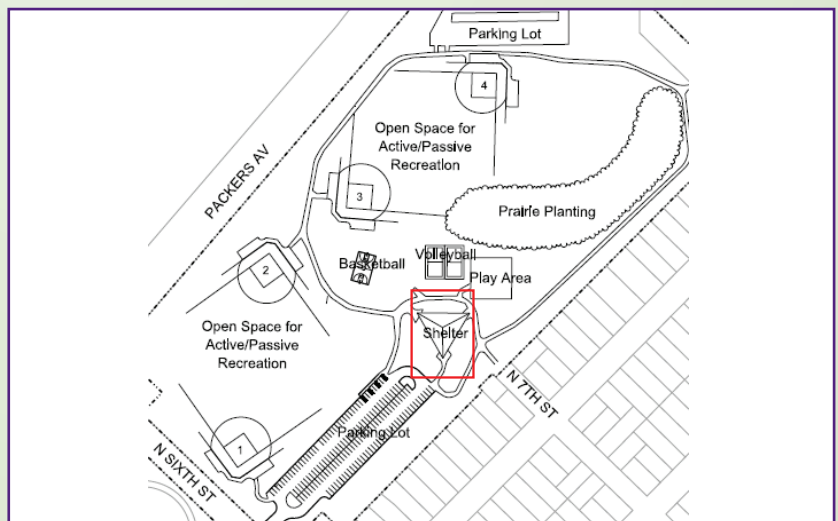

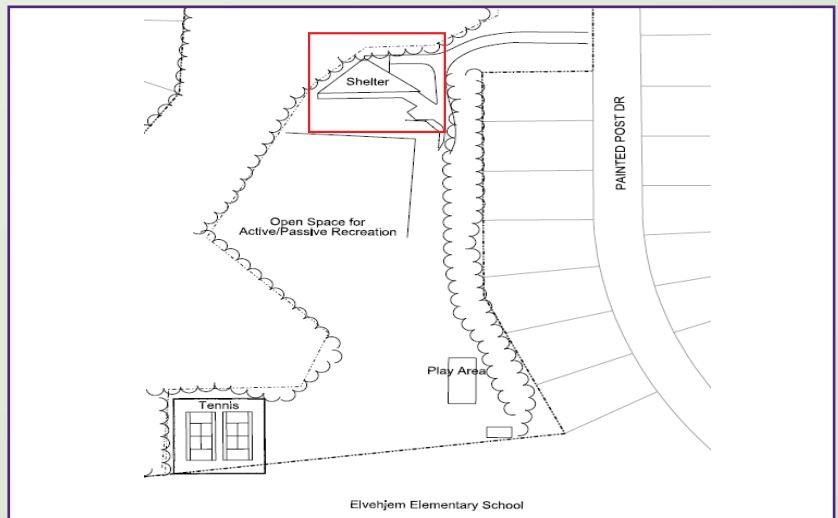

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ELVER PARK

A flour miller and fancy-stock breeder, Elver left a legacy of 50 acres to the City. The First Unitarian Society gave an additional 10 acres and monies for development. The remaining land was purchased by the City.

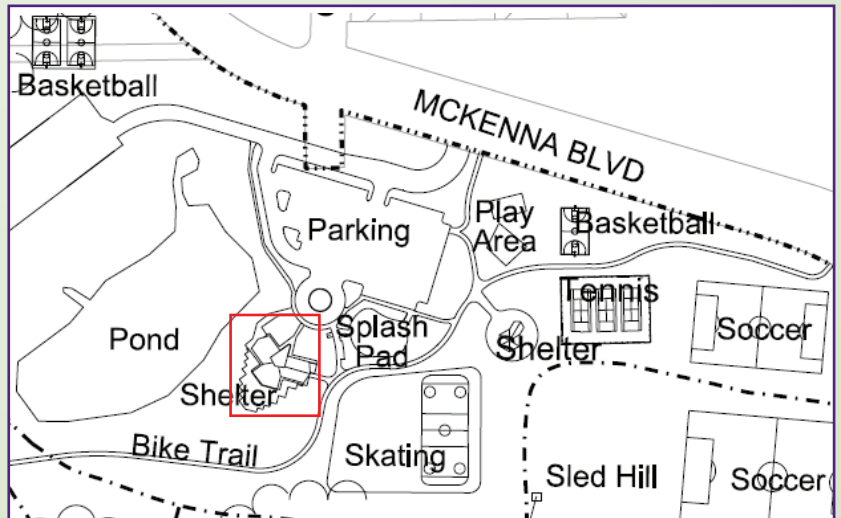

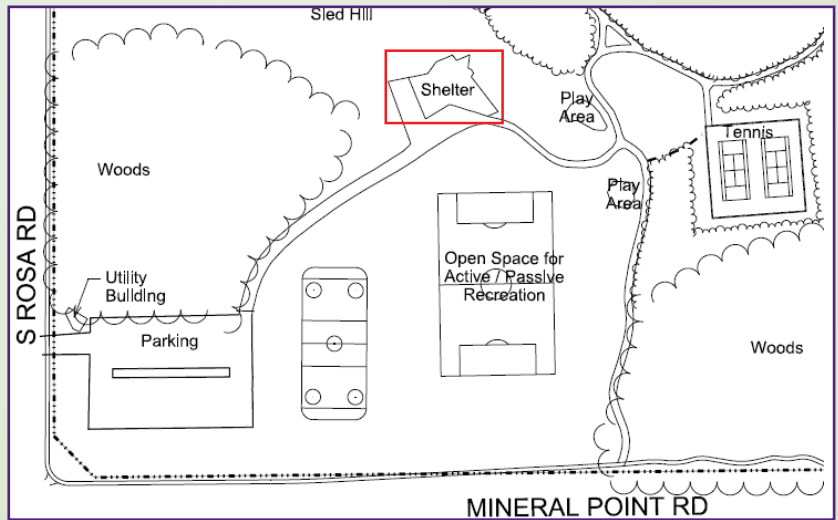

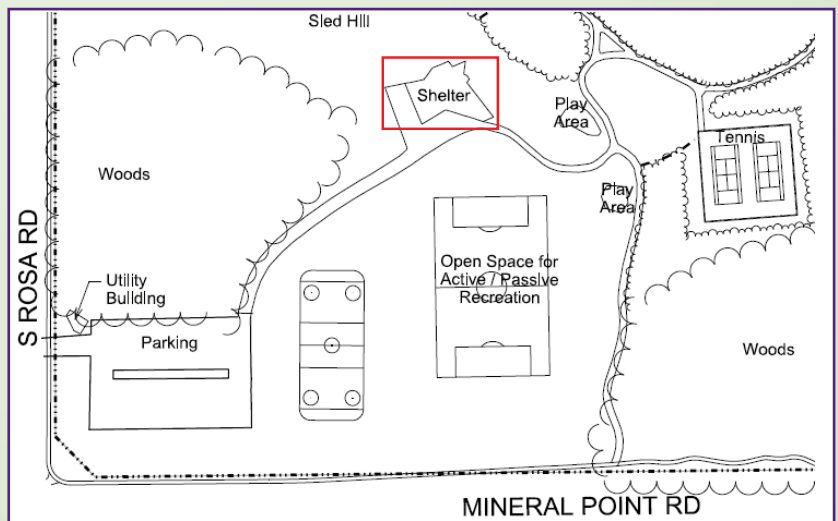

GATES OF HEAVEN SYNAGOGUE

Built in 1863, Gates of Heaven is the fourth-oldest surviving synagogue building in the nation. The building was moved to James Madison Park in 1970. It is a popular location for intimate wedding ceremonies, and the small balcony upstairs seating area provides a wonderful birds-eye view for guests. The Victorian-era Period Gardens, located a block away on the corner of Pinckney Street and Gorham Street, is a beautiful location for photos.

Please note that the restrooms in this historic building are located in the basement and are not ADA accessible. The City of Madison will provide, at no additional cost, a portable accessible restroom for any reservation that makes such a request at least ten (10) days in advance of the date of the event. There is also a preparation area in the basement with a sink, privacy partitions, and a fire extinguisher.

There are lighting and electrical outlets throughout the building. There is also central air and heat.

SHELTER KEYS

Keys may be picked up at 330 East Lakeside Street as early as three (3) business days before your reservation. The Parks Office is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. Keys must be returned to the Parks Office within two (2) business days of the reservation to avoid additional fees.

The Madison Parks Division recommends using free-standing decorations. Balloons are prohibited.

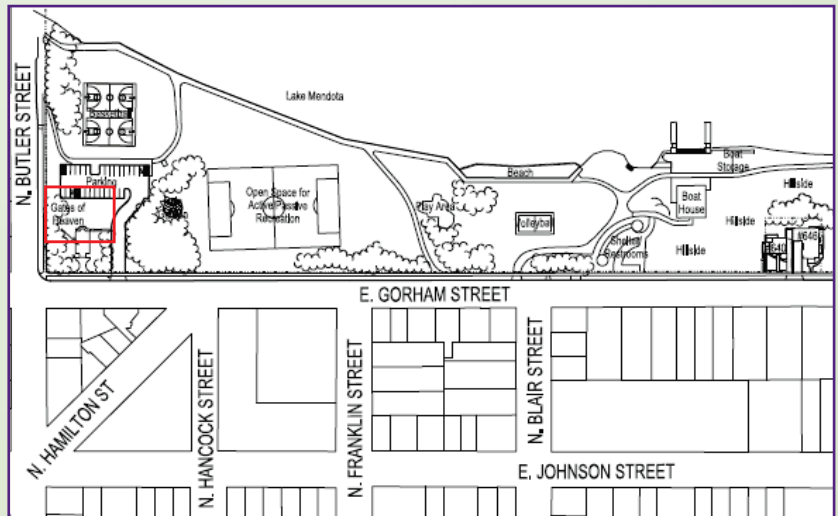

HIGHLAND MANOR PARK

The Community Safe Room serves as a safe place for community residents to take shelter in severe weather situations. The Highland Manor Neighborhood Association provides safety teams that monitor NOAA weather radios and the local radio and television news media to anticipate the development of severe weather. They also open and supervise the building when the National Weather Service issues a tornado watch or greater for Dane County, continuing their supervision until the severe weather event has expired. In addition to the safety teams operation, a special pre-programmed weather radio inside the building will automatically unlock the front door when the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning for Dane County. If the Highland Manor community needs to use the facility during inclement weather during a reservation, the reserving party will receive a full refund.

Due to the dropped ceiling, activities that may cause damage are prohibited: A ceiling hook is available for hanging piñatas or other decorations.

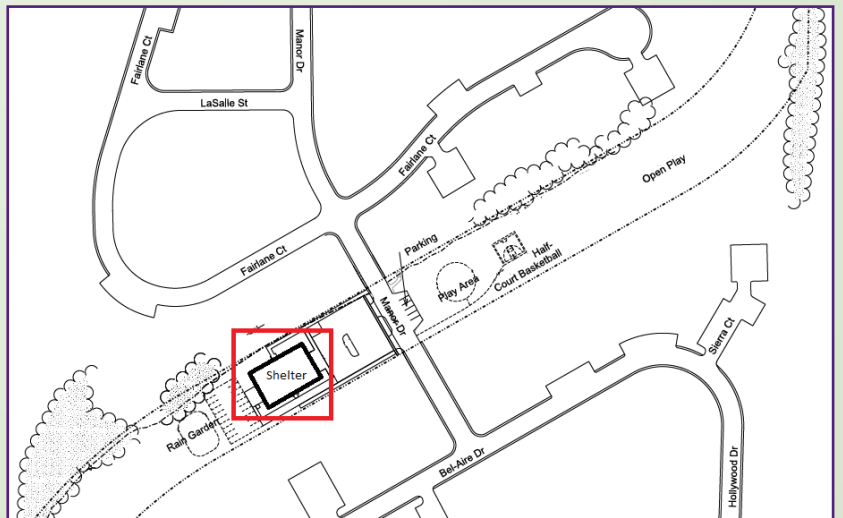

HOYT PARK

The park was designated a City of Madison Landmark on October 2, 1995. Hoyt Park is located on Regent Street, about a half mile west of West High School. The park is next to the former Hoyt School. The origins of present-day Hoyt Park can be traced to 1890 when the City acquired property rights to twenty-four acres of stone quarry which in time grew to its current thirty-one acres through donation and purchase. It was named Hoyt Park in honor of Frank W. Hoyt also known as "The Grand Old Man."

DO NOT use any fasteners (such as staples, nails, tape, etc.) on the walls. You may use painter's tape.

NO GLASS

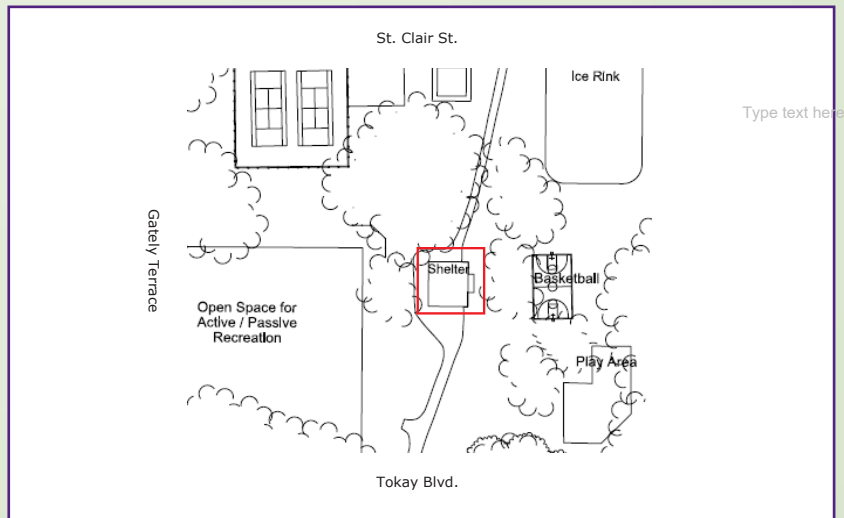
DO NOT bring glass beverage containers into parks.

DO NOT drive or park on the grass or bike paths. Parking is restricted to marked stalls in parking lots.

NO WEAPONS

DO NOT bring weapons into the park shelters and restrooms.
