

Children & Fire Program

The Children and Fire Program helps juvenile firesetters using safety education and counseling. The kids are referred to the program through the schools, Police Department, concerned parents and Madison Fire Department personnel.

Early identification of fire setters along with early intervention can help to reduce or eliminate dangers to the home and community.

Whatever the cause of the fire setting behavior, it may be possible to replace it with more constructive activity. Fire setting causes may also be reduced through guidance and screening.

Free Batteries

Every firehouse in the City of Madison has free 9-volt batteries for your smoke detectors. You are welcome to stop at any fire station between the hours of 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM to pick up a battery for each detector in your home.



Remember to test your smoke detector and practice home fire drills every month!

What We Offer

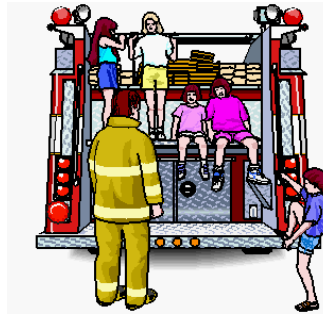
Besides responding to fire and medical emergencies, the City of Madison Fire Department offers many other services.

Fire and Life Safety Education is important to our department and we need your neighborhood to be our partner in this effort.

Station Tours

Groups of 30 or less can book a station tour at any of the City of Madison Fire Stations. Station tours typically include an inside look at a fire truck and ambulance, the tools that are used during fires and medical emergencies, and a demonstration of firefighter gear and how it is used. Some general fire safety information is also typically covered. Station tours take between 30 minutes and 1 hour to complete.

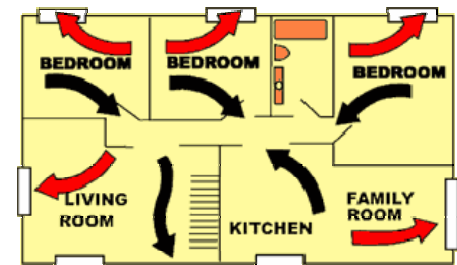
