The City of Madison's Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction - 2019 Edition, as supplemented and amended from time to time, forms a part of these contract documents as if attached hereto.

These standard specifications are available on the City of Madison Public Works website, www.cityofmadison.com/Business/PW/specs.cfm.

The Contractor shall review these Specifications prior to preparation of proposals for the work to be done under this contract, with specific attention to Article 102, "BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS" and Article 103, "AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT." For the convenience of the bidder, below are highlights of three subsections of the specifications.

SECTION 102.1: PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes 66.0901 (2) and (3), all bidders must submit to the Board of Public Works proof of responsibility on forms furnished by the City. The City requires that all bidders be qualified on a biennial basis.

Bidders must present satisfactory evidence that they have been regularly engaged in the type of work specified herein and they are fully prepared with necessary capital, materials, machinery and supervisory personnel to conduct the work to be contracted for to the satisfaction of the City. All bidders must be pre-

qualified by the Board of Public Works for the type of construction on which they are bidding prior to the opening of the bid.

In accordance with Section 39.02(9)(a)l. of the General Ordinances, all bidders shall submit in writing to the Affirmative Action Division Manager of the City of Madison, a Certificate of Compliance or an Affirmative Action Plan at the same time or prior to the submission of the proof of responsibility forms.

The bidder shall be disqualified if the bidder fails to or refuses to, prior to opening of the bid, submit a Certificate of compliance, Affirmative Action Plan or Affirmative Action Data Update, as applicable, as defined by Section 39.02 of the General Ordinances (entitled Affirmative Action) and as required by Section 102.11 of the Standard Specifications.

SECTION 102.4 PROPOSAL

No bid will be accepted that does not contain an adequate or reasonable price for each and every item named in the Schedule of Unit Prices.

A lump sum bid for the work in accordance with the plans and specifications is required. The lump sum bid must be the same as the total amounts bid for the various items and it shall be inserted in the space provided.

All papers bound with or attached to the proposal form are considered a part thereof and must not be detached or altered when the proposal is submitted. The plans, specifications and other documents designated in the proposal form will be considered a part of the proposal whether attached or not.

A proposal submitted by an individual shall be signed by the bidder or by a duly authorized agent. A proposal submitted by a partnership shall be signed by a member/partner or by a duly authorized agent thereof. A proposal submitted by a corporation shall be signed by an authorized officer or duly authorized registered agent of such corporation, and the proposal shall show the name of the State under the laws of which such corporation was chartered. The required signatures shall in all cases appear in the space provided thereof on the proposal.

Each proposal shall be placed, together with the proposal guaranty, in a sealed envelope, so marked as to indicate name of project, the contract number or option to which it applies, and the name and address of the Contractor or submitted electronically through Bid Express (www.bidexpress.com). Proposals will be accepted at the location, the time and the date designated in the advertisement. Proposals received after the time and date designated will be returned to the bidder unopened.

SECTION 102.5: BID DEPOSIT (PROPOSAL GUARANTY)

All bids, sealed or electronic, must be accompanied with a Bid Bond (City of Madison form) equal to at least 5% of the bid or a Certificate of Annual/Biennial Bid Bond or certified check, payable to the City Treasurer. Bid deposit of the successful bidders shall be returned within forty-eight (48) hours following execution of the contract and bond as required.

MINOR DISCREPENCIES

Bidder is responsible for submitting all forms necessary for the City to determine compliance with State and City bidding requirements. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion or performance of the contract.

2 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Information

2.1 Policy and Goal

The City of Madison reaffirms its policy of nondiscrimination in the conduct of City business by maintaining a procurement process which remains open to all who have the potential and ability to sell goods and services to the City. It is the policy of the City of Madison to allow Small Business Enterprises (SBE) maximum feasible opportunity to participate in City of Madison contracting. The bidder acknowledges that its bid has been submitted in accordance with the SBE program and is for the public's protection and welfare.

Please refer to the "ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS" for the goal for the utilization of SBEs on this project. SBEs may participate as subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers, which provide a commercially useful function. The dollar value for SBE suppliers or 'materials only' vendors shall be discounted to 60% for purposes of meeting SBE goals.

A bidder which achieves or exceeds the SBE goal will be in compliance with the SBE requirements of this project. In the event that the bidder is unable to achieve the SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Failure to either achieve the goal or demonstrate a good faith effort to do so will be grounds for the bidder being deemed a non-responsible contractor ineligible for award of this contract.

A bidder may count towards its attainment of the SBE goal only those expenditures to SBEs that perform a commercially useful function. For purposes of evaluating a bidder's responsiveness to the attainment of the SBE goal, the contract participation by an SBE is based on the percentage of the total base bid proposed by the Contractor. The total base bid price is inclusive of all addenda.

Work performed by an SBE firm in a particular transaction can be counted toward the goal only if it involves a commercially useful function. That is, in light of industry practices and other relevant considerations, does the SBE firm have a necessary and useful role in the transaction, of a kind for which there is a market outside the context of the SBE Program, or is the firm's role a superfluous step added in an attempt to obtain credit towards goals? If, in the judgment of the Affirmative Action Division, the SBE firm will not perform a commercially useful function in the transaction, no credit towards goals will be awarded.

The question of whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function is completely separate from the question of whether the firm is an eligible SBE. A firm is eligible if it meets the definitional criteria and ownership and control requirements, as set forth in the City of Madison's SBE Program.

If the City of Madison determines that the SBE firm is performing a commercially useful function, then the City of Madison must then decide what that function is. If the commercially useful function is that of an SBE vendor / supplier that regularly transacts business with the respective product, then the City of Madison will count 60% of the value of the product supplied toward SBE goals.

To be counted, the SBE vendor / supplier must be engaged in selling the product in question to the public. This is important in distinguishing an SBE vendor / supplier, which has a regular trade with a variety of customers, from a firm which performs supplier-like functions on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis or for only one or two contractors with whom it has a special relationship.

A supplier of bulk goods may qualify as an eligible SBE vendor / supplier if it either maintains an inventory or owns or operates distribution equipment. With respect to the distribution equipment; e.g., a fleet of trucks, the term "operates" is intended to cover a situation in which the supplier leases the equipment on a regular basis for its entire business. It is not intended to cover a situation in which the firm simply provides drivers for trucks owned or leased by another party; e.g., a prime contractor, or leases such a party's trucks on an ad hoc basis for a specific job.

If the commercially useful function being performed is not that of a qualified SBE vendor / supplier, but rather that of delivery of products, obtaining bonding or insurance, procurement of personnel, acting as a broker or manufacturer's representative in the procurement of supplies, facilities, or materials, etc., only the fees or commissions will apply towards the goal.

For example, a business that simply transfers title of a product from manufacturer to ultimate purchaser; e. g., a sales representative who re-invoices a steel product from the steel company to the Contractor, or a firm that puts a product into a container for delivery would not be considered a qualified SBE vendor / supplier. The Contractor would not receive credit based on a percentage of the cost of the product for working with such firms.

Concerning the use of services that help the Contractor obtain needed supplies, personnel, materials or equipment to perform a contract: only the fee received by the service provider will be counted toward the goal. For example, use of a SBE sales representative or distributor for a steel company, if performing a commercially useful function at all, would entitle the Contractor receiving the steel to count only the fee paid to the representative or distributor toward the goal. This provision would also govern fees for professional and other services obtained expressly and solely to perform work relating to a specific contract.

Concerning transportation or delivery services: if an SBE trucking company picks up a product from a manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier and delivers the product to the Contractor, the commercially useful function it is performing is not that of a supplier, but simply that of a transporter of goods. Unless the trucking company is itself the manufacturer or a qualified vendor / supplier in the product, credit cannot be given based on a percentage of the cost of the product. Rather, credit would be allowed for the cost of the transportation service.

The City is aware that the rule's language does not explicitly mention every kind of business that may contribute work on this project. In administering these programs, the City would, on a case-by-case basis, determine the appropriate counting formula to apply in a particular situation.

All contractors, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers seeking SBE status must complete and submit the Targeted Business Certification Application to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division by the time and date established for receipt of bids. A copy of the Targeted Business Certification Application is available by contacting the Contract Compliance Officer at the address and telephone indicated in Section 2.2 or you may access the Targeted Business Certification Application online www.cityofmadison.com/dcr/aaTBDir.cfm. Submittal of the Targeted Business Certification Application by the time specified does not guarantee that the applicant will be certified as a SBE eligible to be utilized towards meeting the SBE goal for this project.

2.4 Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report

2.4.1 Good Faith Efforts

Bidders shall take all necessary affirmative steps to assure that SBEs are utilized when possible and that the established SBE goal for this project is achieved. A contractor who self performs a portion of the work, and is pre-qualified to perform that category of work, may subcontract that portion of the work, but shall not be required to do so. When a bidder is unable to achieve the established SBE goal, the bidder must demonstrate that a good faith effort to do so was made. Such a good faith effort should include the following:

- 2.4.1.1 Attendance at the pre-bid meeting.
- 2.4.1.2 Using the City of Madison's directory of certified SBEs to identify SBEs from which to solicit bids.
- 2.4.1.3 Assuring that SBEs are solicited whenever they are potential sources.
- 2.4.1.4 Referring prospective SBEs to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division for certification.
- 2.4.1.5 Dividing total project requirements into smaller tasks and/or quantities, where economically feasible, to permit maximum feasible SBE participation.
- 2.4.1.6 Establishing delivery schedules, where requirements permit, which will encourage participation by SBEs.
- 2.4.1.7 Providing SBEs with specific information regarding the work to be performed.
- 2.4.1.8 Contacting SBEs in advance of the deadline to allow such businesses sufficient time to prepare a bid.
- 2.4.1.9 Utilizing the bid of a qualified and competent SBE when the bid of such a business is deemed reasonable (i.e. 5% above the lowest bidder), although not necessarily low.
- 2.4.1.10 Contacting SBEs which submit a bid, to inquire about the details of the bid and confirm that the scope of the work was interpreted as intended.
- 2.4.1.11 Completion of Cover Page (page C-6), Summary Sheet (page C-7) and SBE Contact Reports (pages C-8 and C9) if applicable.

2.4.2 Reporting SBE Utilization and Good Faith Efforts

The Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report is to be submitted by the bidder with the bid: This report is due by the specified bid closing time and date. Bids submitted without a completed SBE Compliance Report as outlined below may be deemed non-responsible and the bidder ineligible for award of this contract. Nothwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, the City may exercise its discretion to allow bidders to correct or supplement submissions after bid opening, if the minor discrepancy, bid irregularity or omission is insignificant and not one related to price, quality, quantity, time of completion, performance of the contract, or percentage of SBE utilization.

- 2.4.2.1 If the Bidder <u>meets or exceeds</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.1.1 **Cover Page,** Page C-6; and
 - 2.4.2.1.2 Summary Sheet, C-7.
- 2.4.2.2 If the bidder <u>does not meet</u> the goal established for SBE utilization, the Small Business Enterprise Compliance Report shall consist of the following:
 - 2.4.2.2.1 Cover Page, Page C-6;
 - 2.4.2.2.2 **Summary Sheet**, C-7; and
 - 2.4.2.2.3 **SBE Contact Report,** C-8 and C-9. (A <u>separate</u> Contact Report must be completed for <u>each applicable</u> SBE which is <u>not utilized.</u>)

2.5 Appeal Procedure

A bidder which does not achieve the established goal and is found non-responsible for failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to achieve such goal and subsequently denied eligibility for award of contract may appeal that decision to the Small Business Enterprises Appeals Committee. All appeals shall be made in writing, and shall be delivered to and received by the City Engineer no later than 4:30 PM on the third business day following the bidder's receipt of the written notification of ineligibility by the Affirmative Action Division Manager. Postmark not acceptable. The notice of appeal shall state the basis for the appeal of the decision of the Affirmative Action Division Manager. The Appeal shall take place in accordance with Madison General Ordinance 33.54.

2.6 SBE Requirements After Award of the Contract

The successful bidder shall identify SBE subcontractors, suppliers and vendors on the subcontractor list in accordance with the specifications. The Contractor shall submit a detailed explanation of any variances between the listing of SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers on the subcontractor list and the Contractor's SBE Compliance Report for SBE participation.

No change in SBE subcontractors, vendors and/or suppliers from those SBEs indicated in the SBE Compliance Report will be allowed without prior approval from the Engineer and the Affirmative Action Division. The contractor shall submit in writing to the City of Madison Affirmative Action Division a request to change any SBE citing specific reasons which necessitate such a change. The Affirmative Action Division will use a general test of reasonableness in approving or rejecting the contractor's request for change. If the request is approved, the Contractor will make every effort to utilize another SBE if available.

The City will monitor the project to ensure that the actual percentage commitment to SBE firms is carried out.

2.7 SBE Definition and Eligibility Guidelines

A Small Business Enterprise is a business concern awarded certification by the City of Madison. For the purposes of this program a Small Business Enterprise is defined as:

- A. An independent business operated under a single management. The business may not be a subsidiary of any other business and the stock or ownership may not be held by any individual or any business operating in the same or a similar field. In determining whether an entity qualifies as a SBE, the City shall consider all factors relevant to being an independent business including, but not limited to, the date the business was established, adequacy of its resources for the work in which it proposes to involve itself, the degree to which financial, equipment leasing and other relationships exist with other ineligible firms in the same or similar lines of work. SBE owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidents of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their enjoyment interests, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form or arrangements that may be reflected in its ownership documents.
- B. A business that has averaged no more than \$4.0 million in annual gross receipts over the prior three year period and the principal owner(s) do not have a personal net worth in excess of \$1.32 million.

Firm and/or individuals that submit fraudulent documents/testimony may be barred from doing business with the City and/or forfeit existing contracts.

SBE certification is valid for one (1) year unless revoked.

SECTION D: SPECIAL PROVISIONS

DAVIDSON STREET, DEMPSEY ROAD, MAHER AVENUE, PARK COURT, DREXEL AVENUE, AND LAKE EDGE BOULEVARD ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2019 CONTRACT NO. 8305

It is the intent of these Special Provisions to set forth the final contractual intent as to the matter involved and shall prevail over the Standard Specifications and plans whenever in conflict therewith. In order that comparisons between the Special Provisions can be readily made, the numbering system for the Special Provisions is equivalent to that of the Specifications.

Whenever in these Specifications the term "Standard Specifications" appears, it shall be taken to refer to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and Supplements thereto.

SECTION 102.11 BEST VALUE CONTRACTING

This Contract shall be considered a Best Value Contract if the Contractor's bid is equal to or greater than \$62,500 for a single trade contract; or equal to or greater than \$306,000 for a multi-trade contract pursuant to MGO 33.07(7).

ARTICLE 103 AWARD AND EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The awarded Contractor shall completely execute the signing of all contract documents and submit them to City Engineering (Attn: Alane Boutelle, 1600 Emil Street, Madison, WI 53713) prior to 12:00 pm on Friday, July 5, 2019. Delays by the Contractor in submitting the required completed contract documents will not adjust the project completion date. The Payment and Performance Bonds shall be dated no sooner than Wednesday, July 3, 2019.

ARTICLE 104 SCOPE OF WORK

The proposed project is a reconstruction of portions of Davidson Street, Drexel Avenue and Lake Edge Blvd. The limits for the work to be done are on Davidson Street from Drexel Avenue to Maher Avenue; Drexel Avenue from Davidson Street to Lake Edge Blvd; and on Lake Edge Blvd from Major Avenue to Maher Avenue. The total project length is approximately 1525 lineal feet. The existing typical section of streets within the project limits is a rural section with no curb and gutter, and no sidewalk. The streets will be reconstructed to an urban section with new asphalt pavement and curb and gutter. New sidewalk is not proposed with the project.

The work under this contract shall include but not be limited to installation of sanitary sewer, water main, storm sewer, grading, base preparation, curb and gutter, asphalt pavement, drive aprons, minor sidewalk construction, topsoil placement, seeding and restoration.

The Contractor shall view the site prior to bidding to become familiar with the existing conditions. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process.

SECTION 104.4 <u>INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES</u>

The Contractor shall note that some bid item quantities may increase or decrease based on what is encountered in the field at the time of construction. If the actual field conditions vary from the plan quantity, no additional compensation shall be given for increasing or decreasing quantities. Any overruns shall be paid for under the appropriate bid item(s) without any penalty or change to the bid price for the associated bid item. The Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any deletions to the contract. No change to the unit bid price will be allowed for changes to the quantities.

SECTION 105.12 COOPERATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

The City of Madison has been given to understand that work will be undertaken by others in approximately the same time frame and the same area as the proposed project. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to verify this information and any subsequent changes in the scheduling of the work by others and to make corrections in his/her construction timetable as required.

Coordination with Private Utilities

This project will require coordination with private utility companies. There are existing utilities located within the project limits that are to remain. The Contractor will be responsible for coordination and providing work space for any conflict resolution work that will need to be performed by the private utility companies. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve conflicts during the construction process and provide working area for installation of new facilities.

Madison Gas and Electric (Electric)

MG&E may have several power poles that are in conflict with proposed street construction. MG&E plans to resolve any conflicts with power poles during construction. Contact Mark Boem, (608) 842-1704 or mboem@mge.com with questions or to coordinate work in the vicinity of MG&E electric facilities.

Madison Gas and Electric (Gas)

MG&E has gas main that is in conflict with proposed storm sewer crossings. MG&E plans to resolve any gas main conflicts during construction. Contact Roger Ahles, (608) 252-5682 or rahles@mge.com with questions or to coordinate work in the vicinity of MG&E gas facilities.

AT&T (Communications)

AT&T has aerial facilities on MG&E poles within the project limits. AT&T plans to relocate their facilities with MG&E. The contact for coordination with AT&T is Carol Anason, (608) 252-2385.

TDS Telecom

There are no anticipated conflicts with TDS Telecom. Contact Jerry Myres, (608) 664-4404 or jerry.myers@tdstelecom.com if necessary to coordinate work with TDS.

Charter Communications

There are no anticipated conflicts with Charter Communications facilities. Contact Brandon Storm; office (608) 274-3822 ext. 6642, cell (608) 444-9493 if necessary to coordinate work with Charter Communications.

Existing Items to Remain

The Contractor shall use care around existing trees, plantings, fences, walls, steps and driveways that are indicated on the plans to remain. Damage to these items during construction shall be repaired or replaced at the Contractor's expense. The Contractor shall use care around all utilities to remain. All costs to protect existing pipe and structures shall be incidental to construction. Protection of existing structures, which may include temporary plating or ramping with gravel or temporary pavement as necessary shall be considered incidental to the work being performed. No trees shall be cut without the approval of the Engineer and the City Forester; the abutting property owners shall be notified in accordance with the City's Administrative Procedure Memorandum No. 6-2.

The Contractor shall maintain access for property owners, mail delivery and garbage/recycling pickup for all properties in the project area. All private storm sewer discharges shall be maintained for all properties in the project area.

Work in this contract will require utility relocations to install the new sanitary and storm sewer main. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to work with the utilities located in the right of way to resolve

conflicts during the construction process and provide working area for installation of new facilities.

SECTION 107.6 DUST PROOFING

The Contractor shall take all necessary steps to control dust arising from operations connected with this contract. When ordered by the Engineer, the Contractor shall dust proof the construction area by using power sweepers and water. Dust proofing shall be incidental with operations connected with this contract.

SECTION 107.7 MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All signing and barricading shall conform with the Federal Highways Administrations "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD) and the City of Madison Standards for sidewalk and bikeway closures and the State of Wisconsin Standard Detail Drawing S.D.D. 15c 11-5

The Contractor shall submit an acceptable Traffic Control Plan, including all necessary phases, to the office of the City Traffic Engineer, a minimum of five (5) working days, prior to the pre-construction meeting. The Traffic Control Plan shall address all requirements of this section of the Special Provisions. The contractor shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan. The contractor shall not start work on this project until the Traffic Engineering Division has approved a traffic control plan and traffic control devices have been installed, in accordance with the approved plan. Failure of the Contractor to obtain approval of a Traffic Control Plan, as specified above, may prevent the Contractor from starting work and shall be considered a delay of the project, caused by the Contractor. The successful bidder shall work with the City Traffic Engineering Division to develop an approved Traffic Control Plan.

The traffic control plan may need to be altered as conditions change in the field or as unexpected conditions occur. This shall include relocating existing traffic control or providing additional traffic control. This should be considered incidental to providing traffic control for the project.

The Contractor shall not in any manner unnecessarily obstruct the streets or crossings, and shall at all times and under all circumstances provide safe and sufficient means for foot passengers and vehicles.

Construction equipment and materials are not to be stored within the street right-of-way that is open to traffic during non-working hours.

The contractor shall notify (48 hour minimum notice) all residents within the construction limits of this project if the vehicular access is to be cut off to their property.

The work areas shall be backfilled, plated, or protected by traffic control devices during non-working hours. If steel plates are used, the Contractor shall notify the City of Madison Streets Division, 266-4681, 1 working day prior to placement of the plates.

The Contractor shall not remove existing traffic control or street name signs. The Traffic Engineering Field Operations Facility (266-4767) will remove these signs within twenty-four (24) hours, (one work day), upon the Contractor's request.

The contractor shall notify the City of Madison Traffic Operations Section, 266-4767 a minimum of 8 working days prior to opening of a street that has been closed to traffic to permit reinstallation of signs and markings. If landscaping is not complete then the street opening date may be extended to a minimum of 8 days after the landscaping complete. If the street is opened before the installation of permanent signing & marking the contactor shall be responsible for all temporary signs & markings as directed by the City Traffic Engineer.

All streets may be closed to through traffic within the project limits for the duration of the project. Emergency vehicle access to all properties shall be maintained at all times.

The Contractor may remove parking within the project limits. The Contractor shall be responsible for posting and maintaining NO PARKING signs in accordance with City of Madison Police Department's "Guidelines for Temporary No Parking Restrictions for Construction or Special Events".

Contact Mark Winter, Traffic Engineering Division, 266-6543, with any questions concerning these traffic control specifications.

SECTION 108.2 PERMITS

The City of Madison has obtained a City of Madison Erosion Control Permit and has submitted a DNR WRAPP Water Resources Application for Project Permit (formerly known as Notice of Intent (NOI)) to obtain coverage under a Construction Site General Permit.

The Contractor shall meet the conditions of the permits by properly installing and maintaining the erosion control measures shown on the plans, specified in these Special Provisions, or as directed by the Construction Engineer or his designees. This work will be paid for under the appropriate contract bid items or, if appropriate items are not included in the contract, shall be paid for as Extra Work. A copy of the permit is available at the City of Madison, Engineering Division office.

This permit covers trench dewatering to a maximum of 70 gallons/minute from the project, provided appropriate control measures are in place. The City's obtaining this permit is not intended to be exhaustive of all permits that may be required to be obtained by the Contractor for construction of this project. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to identify and obtain any other permits needed for construction.

SECTION 109.2 PROSECUTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall begin work on or after <u>July 15, 2019</u>. The total time of completion of the contract shall be <u>ONE HUNDRED ONE (101)</u> calendar days.

Work shall begin only after the start work letter is received. If it is desirable to begin work before or after the above-mentioned date, the Contractor shall establish a mutually acceptable date with the City Engineer, and the agreed upon date must be determined prior to the preconstruction meeting.

The Contractor shall limit workdays to 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. unless approved by the Engineer in writing.

BID ITEM 20201 - EXCAVATION CUT

DESCRIPTION

All work under this item shall be in accordance with Article 201 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction and as here in modified.

CONSTRUCTION

Comply with Article 201 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Bid Item EXCAVATION CUT shall be measured as a plan quantity by the cubic yard in place. An estimated plan quantity is included in the plans and proposal items.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Bid Item EXCAVATION CUT shall be paid at the contract price, as a plan quantity by the Cubic Yard, measured and calculated as described above, which shall be full compensation for all labor and materials related to the work.

BID ITEM 20336 - PIPE PLUG

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction Latest Edition Article 203.2(c), any pipe found in a trench that is less than 10" in diameter while installing a sewer facility shall be considered incidental to the pipe being installed.

Any pipe plugs required to abandon or remove a sewer access structure (pipes directly connected to the structure) shall be considered incidental to abandoning or removing the structure regardless of the size of the pipe being abandoned.

SECTION 203.2 DISPOSING OF MATERIALS

The Contractor shall comply with Section 203.2 of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction with regard to salvaging castings.

SECTION 210.1(d) STREET SWEEPING

When required, either by the erosion control plan or the Construction Engineer, the Contractor shall perform mechanical street sweeping on all streets or paved surfaces affected by construction equipment, hauling or related construction activities that result in mud tracking or siltation. Mechanical street sweeping shall be completed as directed by the Construction Engineer and shall remove all loose material to the satisfaction of the Construction Engineer. Depending on site conditions, construction activities, and hauling methods utilized by the Contractor mechanical street sweeping may be required multiple times throughout the day with an absolute minimum that all streets are clean at the end of the work day. Areas not accessible by mechanical street sweepers may require hand scraping with shovels.

BID ITEM 21011 – CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE

Work under this bid item shall be in accord with the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. Construction Entrances shall be located by the Construction Engineer and the Contractor based on site needs. The Contractor shall be aware that specifications call for a construction entrance to be 50' long, construction of an entrance not meeting this specification will result in no payment for this item not a partial payment.

ARTICLE 401 CRUSHED AGGREGATE BASE COURSE

The clear stone base course and the crushed stone base course shall be placed on the same day as the existing stone base is removed.

The Contractor shall maintain a minimum of six (6") inches of stone base course (existing or new) on all portions of the roadway open to vehicle access. No additional compensation will be given for stone used to maintain the six (6") required for access.

Crushed stone base course shall be used for bringing temporary ramps to grade. This material shall be reused after ramp is removed.

The material commonly known as crusher run or breaker run shall be used in undercut areas as designated by the Engineer.

ARTICLE 500 SEWERS AND SEWER STRUCTURES

The sewer designer for the project is Kyle Frank. He may be contacted at (608) 266-4098 or kfrank@cityofmadison.com.

SANITARY SEWER GENERAL

This project shall include installing approximately 1252.5 feet of new 8" PVC SDR-35 & 26 sewer main and 533 feet of new sanitary lateral.

ASTM D3034 SDR-35 & 26 sewer main and lateral as called for on the plan set shall be payable under Sanitary Sewer Main (Bid Item 50301) and Sanitary Lateral (Bid Item 50353).

All new sanitary sewer access structures shall include Neenah R-1550 castings with the new City of Madison casting detail (see S.D.D. 5.7.16) of the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2019 ed. All new sewer main connections may be factory cored and shall be included in the structure. All existing main connections shall be field cored to accommodate existing conditions and shall be compensated under BID ITEM 50791 SANITARY SEWER TAP. All sewer main and/or laterals not slated for replacement that are damaged during the installation of a structure shall be replaced by the Contractor and shall be considered incidental to the project. All benches and flowlines shall have a smooth trowel finish.

Contractors shall have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal. No additional compensation shall be awarded beyond this amount for the replacement of a sewer lateral. If laterals called for reinstatement on the plans are to be plugged under the direction of the engineer on-site, Contractors are required to use a sonde device to confirm that the laterals are not active.

All sanitary sewer laterals on this project were located by television inspection of the main and from City records.

On any streets where sanitary sewer is replaced before existing water main is abandoned, a temporary water supply system shall be installed and maintained until the new water main is installed and put into service and shall be paid under BID ITEM 70110 TEMPORARY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM

It is advised that the Contractor visit the site prior to bidding to determine the type of trench protection that will be necessary for the sanitary sewer main installation.

STORM SEWER GENERAL

Storm sewer pipe work shall include installing approximately 1168 feet of new storm sewer of various sizes ranging from 12" to 36".

Reconnection of existing pipes at new or existing structures, or new pipes at new or existing structures, shall be considered to be part of the work required to construct the new structure or to construct the new sewer pipe and shall not be rewarded with additional compensation. However, if the structure being removed is larger than the new structure, thus requiring additional pipe, the new pipe shall be paid under the appropriate bid item and the connection of the old pipe to the new pipe shall be accomplished with a concrete collar.

Where a new structure is to be constructed at an existing pipe, it is expected that the Contractor shall saw cut the existing pipe in the required location to accommodate the placement of the new structure. If the Contractor for his or her convenience deems it more suitable to remove the existing pipe to a full joint, the additional pipe and concrete collar required to reconnect to the new structure stall be the Contractor's responsibility and shall not be compensated.

Connection of new pipes to existing structures shall be accommodated with a Storm Sewer Tap - Bid Item 50792.

Precast structures are only allowed where field poured structures are not specifically called for, and no precast structures are allowed until ULO's are completed and approval of the design engineer has been received.

BID ITEM 50353 - SANITARY SEWER LATERAL (SDR 35 & 26)

Sanitary sewer laterals shown on the construction plans were located by City television inspection and records only.

Where the existing sanitary sewer laterals are being extended to connect to the new sanitary sewer main (being installed in a different location as the existing main), pipe plugs shall be required to plug the existing sanitary sewer main on both sides of the old lateral location. The pipe plugs shall be considered incidental to the bid price for SANITARY SEWER LATERAL. All work associated with this bid item shall comply with Article 503 of the Standard Specifications.

Per the City of Madison Standard Specifications for sanitary sewer lateral construction on street reconstruction projects, Contractors are encouraged to begin installation of sanitary lateral pipe at the proposed sewer main. If Contractor starts excavation for the lateral at the property line, it shall be at the Contractor's risk. No Utility Line Openings (ULOs) will be granted for the inability to locate the sanitary lateral at the property line. Any extra sidewalk removal will not be compensated to the Contractor looking for an existing sanitary lateral at the property line. Contractors are encouraged to have a locator device on-site if they intend to start laying lateral pipe at the property line to minimize the amount of extra sidewalk removal.

Proposed sanitary lateral locations near trees are subject to change based upon data obtained in the field and property owner involvement. Excavation near trees shall comply with Article 107.13 of the Standard Specifications. If 5 ft of separation from the tree to the excavation cannot be maintained, lateral replacement shall stop at the curb.

BID ITEM 50356 - RECONNECT

The first 5' of pipe shall be included with this bid item regardless of pipe type or fittings used. Beyond 5' shall be paid for separately (Bid Item 50353).

The first 5' of sewer lateral pipe/ fittings measured from the sewer main shall be considered the reconnect for all sewer lateral reconnections. Lateral connections connecting to sewer access structures shall be paid for separately as a sanitary tap. 5' of lateral pipe is not considered incidental to the sanitary tap connection.

Riser pipes on laterals shall be built in conformance with S.D.D. 5.3.1 and paid for as a reconnect (Bid Item 50356) and sanitary lateral (Bid Item 50353).

BID ITEM 50371 – LATERAL BACKFLOW PREVENTER

Work under this bid item shall include installation of a sanitary backflow preventer (backwater valve) on all new laterals installed, unless noted on the plan set.

The backflow preventer shall be the Rector Clean Seal or approved equivalent. Installation of the backflow preventer shall be in accordance with manufacturers' specifications and in accordance with S.D.D. 5.7.40.

The lateral backflow preventer shall be installed within the public right of way, between the property line and the back of curb.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

LATERAL BACKFLOW PREVENTER shall be measured separately as each for each sewer lateral installation, acceptably completed.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

LATERAL BACKFLOW PREVENTER, measured as described, will be paid for at the contract price, and is considered full compensation for all work, labor and coincidental materials necessary to complete the work.

BID ITEM 50390 - SEWER ELECTRONIC MARKERS

With regard to the City of Madison Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction 2019 Edition Section 503.3(c), each sanitary lateral shall have a minimum of two (2) electronic markers with the City providing the Contractor with the required number of electronic markers. For sanitary laterals, which only include the installation of a wye, a marker ball shall be installed directly above the wye connection to the main.

BID ITEM 50801 - UTILITY LINE OPENING (ULO)

The work under this item shall be completed in accordance with Article 508 of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction. It is the discretion of the Contractor to locate utilities by either a trench excavation or by a pothole technique. However, the Contractor shall not be compensated more than once for multiple utilities located within a maximum distance of five (5) feet long.

This contract includes 5 additional undistributed ULOs to be performed at the direction of the Engineer.

SECTION 701 PROVISIONS FOR WATER INSTALLATION AND ABANDONMENT

This project consists of water main improvements on Lake Edge Boulevard, from the Major Avenue intersection to the Maher Avenue intersection; Drexel Avenue, from the Davidson Street intersection to the Lake Edge Boulevard intersection; and on Davidson Street, from the Drexel Avenue intersection to the Maher Avenue intersection (see Sheets W-1 to W-5).

The water main infrastructure in this area currently consists of 6-inch and 8-inch cast-iron pipe from the 1950's. A general outline of the work is as follows:

- Furnish and install new 8-inch ductile iron water main and fittings as shown on the plans.
- Reconnect or replace existing services as shown on the plans.
- Abandon the existing 1950's cast-iron water main with a series of "cut-off" points as shown on the plans.
- Abandon valve boxes on abandoned water main.
- Adjust new valve boxes, hydrants, and curb boxes to appropriate grades.

Once the new systems have passed the required pressure and water quality tests, cut off, extend as necessary, and reconnect the existing water service laterals to the new water mains (unless the service is to be abandoned). Services will be reconnected to the new main as shown on the plans.

Take all necessary precautions to protect the existing Madison Water Utility system and ensure its proper functioning during construction. However, due to the layout of existing utilities, a water main bypass setup may be required for 4011 Drexel Avenue. This will allow the water main between the southern paving limits on Drexel Avenue and STA 12±75 to be abandoned before the installation of the proposed sanitary sewer. Review the requirements regarding water main bypass setups in the sanitary sewer special provisions, as well as the standard specifications.

View the site prior to bidding and become familiar with existing conditions and utilities.

SECTION 702 MATERIALS

Furnish all materials, labor and equipment necessary to complete this project except any proposed tapping sleeves, tapping valves and tapping valve boxes. Water Utility will furnish the tapping sleeves, tapping valve boxes, and the crew to perform the taps.

SECTION 703 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Perform all work in accordance with these provisions and the City of Madison *Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction*, 2019 edition. Keep all valves accessible and functioning throughout the duration of the work or directed otherwise by the Water Utility representative.

In addition to the construction methods required by the Standard Specifications, the following requirements apply to work under this Contract:

BID ITEM 70053 REPLACE 1-INCH COPPER SERVICE LATERAL

Service lateral work in conflict with tree protection specifications and/or damaged service laterals may require relocation or replacement of the lateral. Any service lateral work other than what is designated on the plans must be authorized in advance by the Water Utility Inspector.

EXISTING WATER LATERALS LOCATED IN PROXIMITY OF PROPOSED SEWERS

Adjust elevation of existing copper laterals, as necessary, to accommodate the installation of the proposed sewer facilities. Any required adjustment of existing water laterals performed to accommodate elevations of proposed sewers is considered incidental to the construction of the sewer systems.

EXISTING WATER MAIN CONFLICTS WITH PROPOSED SANITARY SEWERS

If the sanitary sewer is installed before the proposed water main, a series of cut-offs must be performing on the existing water main beforehand. Temporary flushing hydrants must be installed on any stubs left un-looped (see cut-off on Sheet W-2 and W-4). A temporary water service may be needed to maintain water service to 4011 Drexel Avenue while the sanitary sewer is being installed. Refer to the standard specifications for details on a water bypass setup.


Field verify the location of the water service lateral to 4102 Drexel Avenue. Adjust the location of this water cut-off and temporary flushing hydrant accordingly.

Any other options to maintain or provide water service to all property owners in the affected area, during the installation of the proposed sanitary sewer, must be presented to the Water Utility designer and inspector before project start.

WN9	Furnish the ditch, compaction and all materials and labor for the installation of new service lateral.
WN10	Remove and salvage existing hydrant.
WN11	Replace the existing copper service with a new copper service.

SECTION H: AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 3d day of in the year Two Thousand and Nineteen between R. G. HUSTON CO., INC. hereinafter called the Contractor, and the City of Madison, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the City.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the said City of Madison under the provisions of a resolution adopted <u>JULY 2, 2019</u>, and by virtue of authority vested in the said Council, has awarded to the Contractor the work of performing certain construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the City, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

Scope of Work. The Contractor shall, perform the construction, execution and completion of the following listed complete work or improvement in full compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Standard Specifications, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions and contract; perform all items of work covered or stipulated in the proposal; perform all altered or extra work; and shall furnish, unless otherwise provided in the contract, all materials, implements, machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, transportation, and labor necessary to the prosecution and completion of the work or improvements:

DAVIDSON STREET, DEMPSEY ROAD, MAHER AVENUE, PARK COURT, DREXEL AVENUE, AND LAKE EDGE BOULEVARD ASSESSMENT DISTRICT - 2019 CONTRACT NO. 8305

- 2. **Completion Date/Contract Time.** Construction work must begin within seven (7) calendar days after the date appearing on mailed written notice to do so shall have been sent to the Contractor and shall be carried on at a rate so as to secure full completion <u>SEE SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>, the rate of progress and the time of completion being essential conditions of this Agreement.
- 3. **Contract Price.** The City shall pay to the Contractor at the times, in the manner and on the conditions set forth in said specifications, the sum of <u>ONE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY-FIVE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND NO/100</u> (\$1.485,400.00) Dollars being the amount bid by such Contractor and which was awarded to him/her as provided by law.
- 4. Affirmative Action. In the performance of the services under this Agreement the Contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, religion, marital status, age, color, sex, disability, national origin or ancestry, income level or source of income, arrest record or conviction record, less than honorable discharge, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender identity, political beliefs, or student status. The Contractor further agrees not to discriminate against any subcontractor or person who offers to subcontract on this contract because of race, religion, color, age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

The Contractor agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this agreement, the Contractor will provide to the City Affirmative Action Division certain workforce utilization statistics, using a form to be furnished by the City.

If the contract is still in effect, or if the City enters into a new agreement with the Contractor, within one year after the date on which the form was required to be provided, the Contractor will provide updated workforce information using a second form, also to be furnished by the City. The second form will be submitted to the City Affirmative Action Division no later than one year after the date on which the first form was required to be provided.

The Contractor further agrees that, for at least twelve (12) months after the effective date of this contract, it will notify the City Affirmative Action Division of each of its job openings at facilities in Dane County for which applicants not already employees of the Contractor are to be considered.

The notice will include a job description, classification, qualifications and application procedures and deadlines. The Contractor agrees to interview and consider candidates referred by the Affirmative Action Division if the candidate meets the minimum qualification standards established by the Contractor, and if the referral is timely. A referral is timely if it is received by the Contractor on or before the date started in the notice.

Articles of Agreement Article I

The Contractor shall take affirmative action in accordance with the provisions of this contract to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national original and that the employer shall provide harassment free work environment for the realization of the potential of each employee. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship insofar as it is within the control of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants notices to be provided by the City setting out the provisions of the nondiscrimination clauses in this contract.

Article II

The Contractor shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractors state that all qualified or qualifiable applicants will be employed without regard to race, religion, color, age, marital status, disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin.

Article III

The Contractor shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided by the City advising the labor union or worker's representative of the Contractor's equal employment opportunity and affirmative action commitments. Such notices shall be posted in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

Article V

The Contractor agrees that it will comply with all provisions of the Affirmative Action Ordinance of the City of Madison, including the contract compliance requirements. The Contractor agrees to submit the model affirmative action plan for public works contractors in a form approved by the Affirmative Action Division Manager.

Article VI

The Contractor will maintain records as required by Section 39.02(9)(f) of the Madison General Ordinances and will provide the City Affirmative Action Division with access to such records and to persons who have relevant and necessary information, as provided in Section 39.02(9)(f). The City agrees to keep all such records confidential, except to the extent that public inspection is required by law.

Article VII

In the event of the Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to comply with the Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Provisions of this contract or Section 39.03 and 39.02 of the Madison General Ordinances, it is agreed that the City at its option may do any or all of the following:

- 1. Cancel, terminate or suspend this Contract in whole or in part.
- 2. Declare the Contractor ineligible for further City contracts until the Affirmative Action requirements are met.
- 3. Recover on behalf of the City from the prime Contractor 0.5 percent of the contract award price for each week that such party fails or refuses to comply, in the nature of liquidated damages, but not to exceed a total of five percent (5%) of the contract price, or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), whichever is less. Under public works contracts, if a subcontractor is in noncompliance, the City may recover liquidated damages from the prime Contractor in the manner described above. The preceding sentence shall not be construed to prohibit a prime Contractor from recovering the amount of such damage from the non-complying subcontractor.

Article VIII

The Contractor shall include the above provisions of this contract in every subcontract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor as necessary to enforce such provisions, including sanctions provided for noncompliance.

Article IX

The Contractor shall allow the maximum feasible opportunity to small business enterprises to compete for any subcontracts entered into pursuant to this contract. (In federally funded contracts the terms "DBE, MBE and WBE" shall be substituted for the term "small business" in this Article.)

- 5. Substance Abuse Prevention Program Required. Prior to commencing work on the Contract, the Contractor, and any Subcontractor, shall have in place a written program for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees as required under Wis. Stat. Sec. 103.503.
- 6. Contractor Hiring Practices.

Ban the Box - Arrest and Criminal Background Checks. (Sec. 39.08, MGO)

This provision applies to all prime contractors on contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2016, and all subcontractors who are required to meet prequalification requirements under MGO 33.07(7)(I), MGO as of the first time they seek or renew pre-qualification status on or after January 1, 2016. The City will monitor compliance of subcontractors through the pre-qualification process.

- a. Definitions. For purposes of this section, "Arrest and Conviction Record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been questioned, apprehended, taken into custody or detention, held for investigation, arrested, charged with, indicted or tried for any felony, misdemeanor or other offense pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.
 - "Conviction record" includes, but is not limited to, information indicating that a person has been convicted of a felony, misdemeanor or other offense, placed on probation, fined, imprisoned or paroled pursuant to any law enforcement or military authority.
 - "Background Check" means the process of checking an applicant's arrest and conviction record, through any means.
- **b.** Requirements. For the duration of this Contract, the Contractor shall:

- 1. Remove from all job application forms any questions, check boxes, or other inquiries regarding an applicant's arrest and conviction record, as defined herein.
- 2. Refrain from asking an applicant in any manner about their arrest or conviction record until after conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 3. Refrain from conducting a formal or informal background check or making any other inquiry using any privately or publicly available means of obtaining the arrest or conviction record of an applicant until after a conditional offer of employment is made to the applicant in question.
- 4. Make information about this ordinance available to applicants and existing employees, and post notices in prominent locations at the workplace with information about the ordinance and complaint procedure using language provided by the City.
- 5. Comply with all other provisions of Sec. 39.08, MGO.
- **c. Exemptions:** This section shall not apply when:
 - 1. Hiring for a position where certain convictions or violations are a bar to employment in that position under applicable law, or
 - 2. Hiring a position for which information about criminal or arrest record, or a background check is required by law to be performed at a time or in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance, including a licensed trade or profession where the licensing authority explicitly authorizes or requires the inquiry in question.

To be exempt, Contractor has the burden of demonstrating that there is an applicable law or regulation that requires the hiring practice in question, if so, the contractor is exempt from all of the requirements of this ordinance for the position(s) in question.
