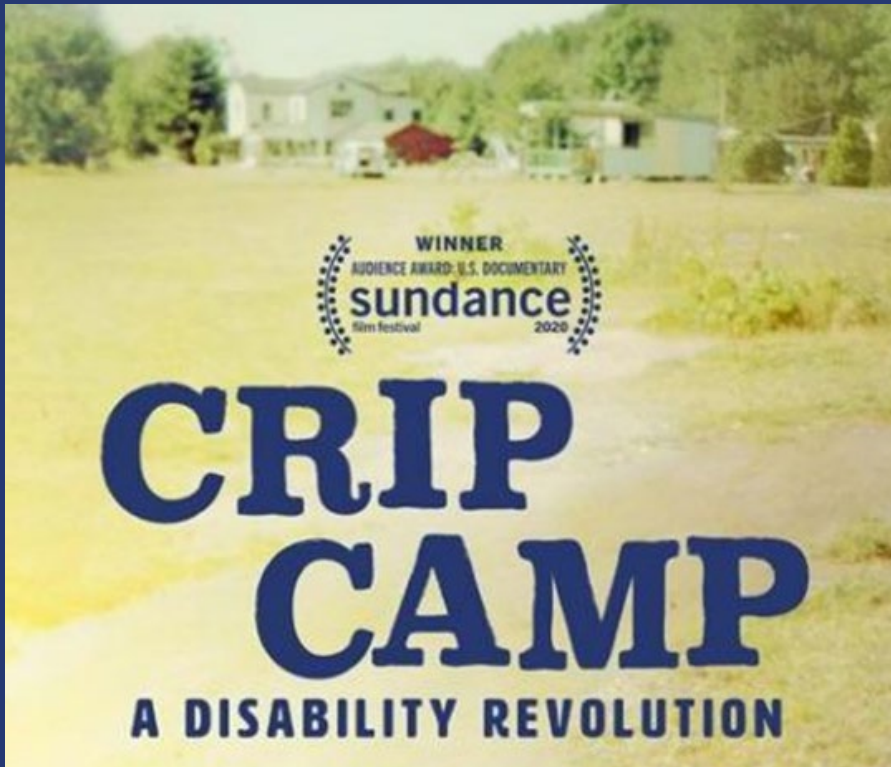


Crip Camp Screening: July 18
