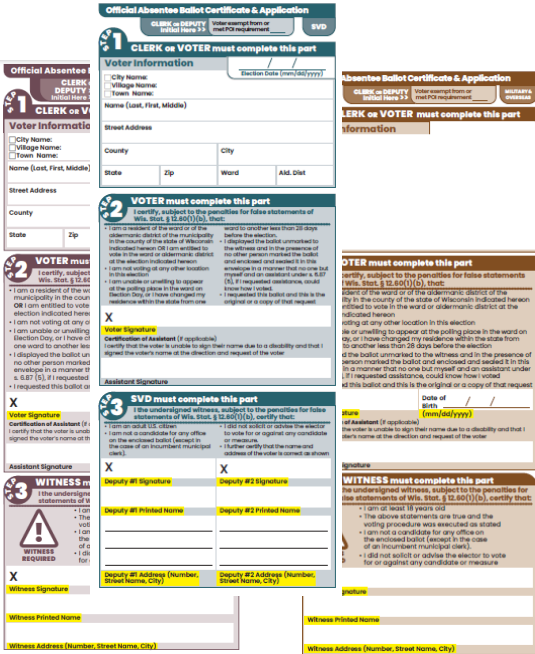

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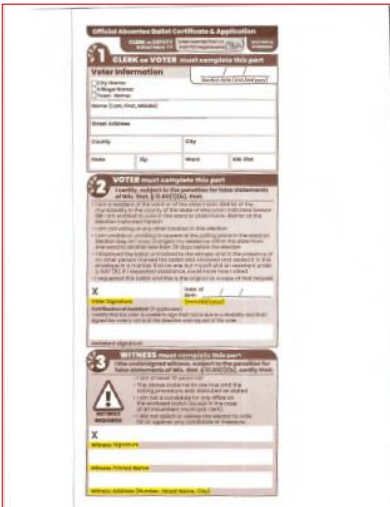

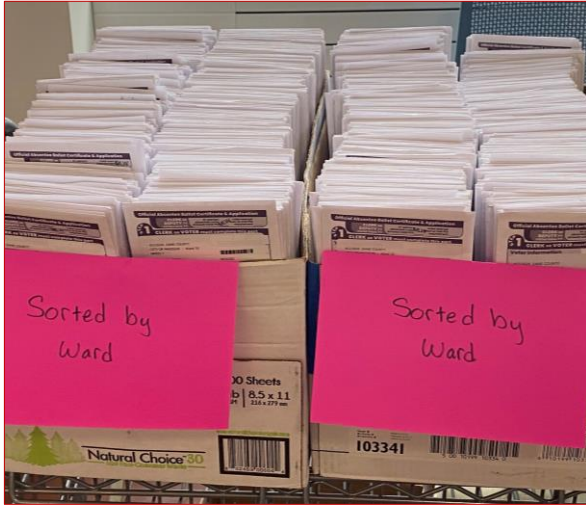

Election Inspectors

- Ballots of absentee voters which are rejected pursuant to the provisions of §6.05, Wis. Stats., shall be kept in their certificate envelopes and returned enclosed in the carrier envelope to the municipal clerk.
- These ballots may not be counted, and the names of voters may not be entered on the poll list or assigned a number on the registration list.
- Each ballot should be numbered and the reason for rejection listed on the back of the ballot and on the Inspectors' Statement (IS-104) and on the Absentee Ballot Log.
- This envelope will be returned by the inspectors to the municipal clerk after the poll is closed. (§6.05(3)(b), Wis. Stats.)

Municipal and County Clerks

- The municipal clerk is responsible for delivery of this envelope to the county clerk by 4 p.m. on the day following the election if a county, state or federal election is held in conjunction with this election for which these ballots were cast. If there is no county, state or federal election held in conjunction with this election, the envelope shall be kept by the municipal clerk or returned to the clerk responsible for administering the election for which the absentee ballots were cast. (§7.5(1)(b), Wis. Stats.)
- In the event of a recount, the county clerk, or appropriate municipal clerk will return the envelope to the board of canvassers responsible for conducting the recount. (§6.07, Wis. Stats.)

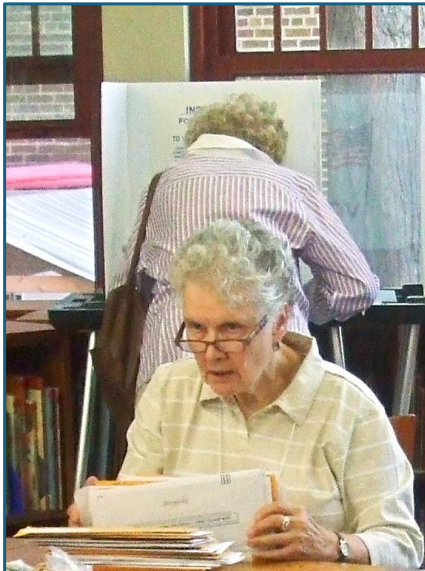

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3. Check Ineligible List

If on ineligible list, use challenge procedure

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4. Check absentee voters into poll book

- Three at a time
- Announce voter's name and address
- Voter slip written in poll books and on envelope, followed by an A

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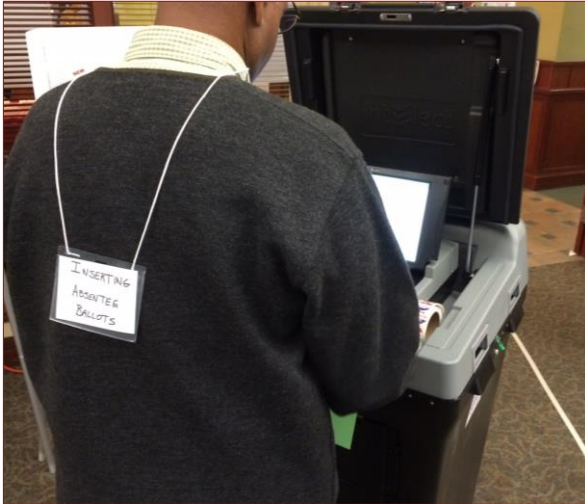


Already Checked Into Poll Book?

Reject absentee

1. Document on Incident Log

2. Envelope stays sealed
3. Put in rejected absentee envelope

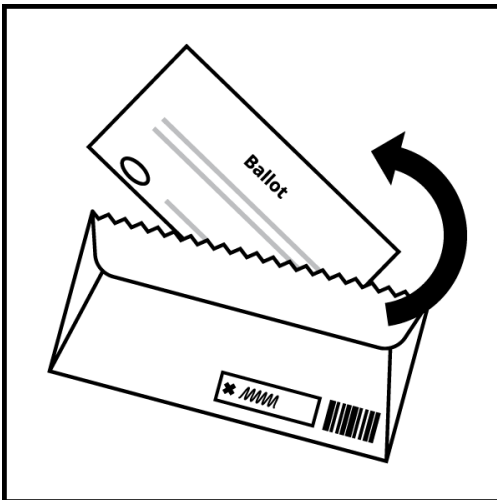
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5. Open and Count

- Open absentee envelopes only after a voter number is assigned at the poll book
- We do not keep track of who marked which ballot
- Flatten ballots
- Check that tabulator will be able to read ballots
- Do not rush through tabulator

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Two Ballots in Envelope

- If both ballots are marked, reseal them in envelope and reject
- If only one ballot is marked, count marked ballot and leave blank ballot in envelope

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Absentees that need to be Remade

- Marked with red or green pen
- Creatively marked
- Printed on copy paper
- Torn when opening envelope
- Ballots with overvotes
- Braille ballots

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Remaking Absentees

- Two poll workers work as a team
- Bring ballot that needs remade to ballot table to get replacement ballot and good/bad stickers
- Invite observers to watch
- Determine voter intent


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Good/Bad Stickers

- Use stickers for sequential numbering
- Put on ballot blank space
- Do not cover any ballot markings

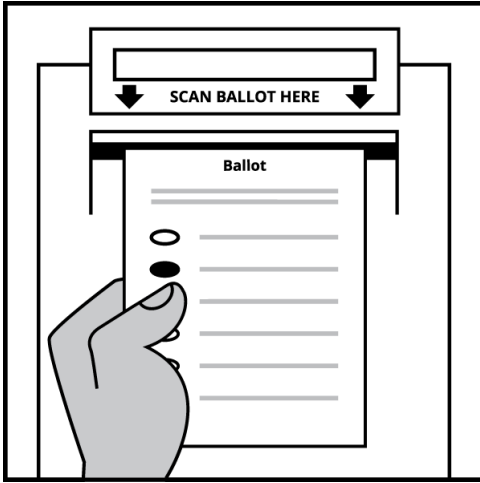

- Tabulator does not have the power to reject
- Only poll workers can reject absentees, and only based on certificate
- Assigning a voter slip number is accepting the ballot

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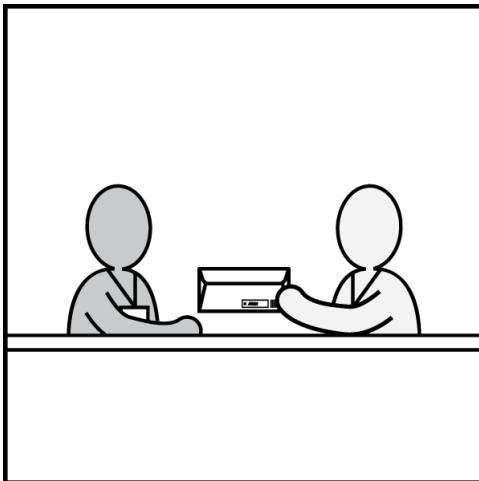
Hand-Delivered Absentees

- Ask, “Are you the voter?”
- Do not ask for ID.
- If voter is delivering their own ballot, check that envelope is complete and sealed.
- Document delivery
