Operating Budget:

- Trash disposal: \$10.1M
- Snow & Ice: \$8.5M
- Brush / leaves / drop-off sites: \$6.5M
- Right of Way (Street Repair, Roadside Debris, etc.): \$3.4M



Capital Budget: \$4.1 Million

- South Point Rd / Streets West Consulting: \$1.9M
- Equipment: \$1.7M
- Tree purchase: \$340K



South Point Rd (2027)

- West side public works agency planning began in 1992.
 - Per a 1992 memo: "The west side has grown rapidly in the past 20 years...Travel time to and from sections of the far west side is extensive...results in slower response times and inefficient use of resources."



South Point Rd site currently salt storage, drop-off site, scale, vehicle storage building, and fuel pumps. RFPs to begin South Point are out.

Resource Recovery Special Charge

Generates \$3.4, million in 2025

Pay for recycling services

Paid on Municipal Services bill by residents and businesses who receive curbside recycling collection.

The rate for 2025 is \$3.58 per month per dwelling unit for residential users and \$3.58 per cart for commercial users.



Urban Forestry Special Charge

- Generates \$7.56 million in 2025
- Funds entire Urban Forestry operations
- Charge paid on Municipal Services bill.
- Monthly rate varies by property type. Residential rate for 2023 is \$7.56



Stormwater Utility & Streets Division Services

\$4.5 million of the Stormwater Utility covers Streets Division operations

- \$1.7 million leaf
 - collection\$2.8 million street sweeper
 - operation
