 - iii. Only wood fiber mulch and shredded rubber mulch meet those requirements
- Project Location & Site Constraints
 - a. Adjacent Playgrounds
 - i. There are 5 existing playgrounds with proximity to Portland Park.

b. Site Conditions

- i. The existing playground location will not be re-used
- The playground will be located closer to Portland Parkway per the Master Plan approved by the Board of Park Commissioners in February of 2020.
- iii. 2-3 new backed benches will be added adjacent to and/or within the new playground footprint.
- iv. A paved path connection will be added to connect the playground to the existing path.
- v. Existing equipment and pea gravel surface will be fully removed with project Parks staff makes every effort to reuse and recycle as many components as possible.
- vi. The existing picnic shelter near the existing playground will remain.

• Project Timetable

a. Construction in 2025 – Parks will keep the existing playground in service while the new playground is constructed.

Project Budget

a. Approximately \$40,000 for the playground equipment.

• Kennedy Park Equipment and Play Surfacing Selection

- a. Age Group: attendees reached consensus for intended age range choosing a 512 structure. Attendees noted they would like some elements for 2-5
 incorporated.
- **b. Surfacing:** Two attendees commented with support to use **recycled rubber surfacing**.
- c. Playlines: After discussion & review attendees selected the playground manufacturer Burke. Attendees noted the following desires for the next designs:
 - Include canopy/shade into the structure
 - Include ground play elements for younger children
 - Include monkey bars, slides, and faux rock climbing features
 - Incorporate search and find symbols like are used at McGinnis Park
 - Consider incorporating some nature-based play (would be in exchange for structure pieces)
- d. Colors: Attendees noted unanimous support for bright, vibrant colors to accentuate the nearby wildflowers. Color choices included Purple, Pine Green, Limon, and Sky.
- e. **Fundraising**: Attendees did not feel there is capacity for fundraising.
