### New Horse Addition!

In February the team entered into a trial contract with James Rotzoll, owner of a Clydesdale/Hackney named Thor. Given COVID restrictions and civil unrest stemming from the George Floyd incident on May 25, the team was unable to adequately evaluate Thor during the initial trial period. This lead to several extensions to the trial

period which ultimately went through July 15<sup>th</sup>. Over this time frame, the Friends of Madison Mounted Horse Patrol (FOMM) graciously covered the costs to have professional horse trainer Kelly Messera work with and evaluate Thor. This proved invaluable and gave the team greater insight as to Thor's potential as a police mount. At the conclusion of the trial period, it was the team's recommendation to move ahead with the purchase of Thor. This was approved by Acting Chief Wahl and Thor was purchased shortly thereafter through a donation by FOMM in the sum of \$3,500.



Thor, a gelding
Clydesdale/Hackney
cross, was born May 29, 2010. He is approximately 17 hands high and
weighs roughly 1,600 pounds. He is a very friendly horse who is
motivated by treats!

During his two-year probationary period he will continue to learn his role as a police mount while acclimating to the streets of Madison. If he is able to pass all requirements, he will become a full-fledged member of the mounted unit in the summer of 2022!

## Horse Sponsorship

In 2020, the horse sponsorship program continued its success. All six horses were sponsored at the annual rate of \$5000/ea. This funding is used to ensure the horses get the proper care, training and equipment they need to be successful in their roles. Typically, sponsors receive a visit from their horse at a place of their choosing. With COVID concerns and restrictions, these visits were largely.

### **Training**

### Pete Ramey Hoof Clinic

Most of this years specialized training had to be cancelled due to COVID restrictions. This included the NAMUCA conference, the UW Large Animal Rescue course and joint training with the Wisconsin State Fair Police. We were however able to send Officers Tom Coyne and Ruben Gonzalez to a two-day hoof care clinic hosted by renowned hoof specialist Pete Ramey. As a department who does all of its own farrier work, this clinic provided a framework for Tom and Ruben to build on. Day three consisted of hoof dissection with our veterinarian, Howard Ketover of Irongate Equine and Officer Ken Mulry, our team farrier. Here they studied the various parts of the hoof and how each part works with the other parts to make it a functional system. On day four Ken provided hands-on training as Tom and Ruben trimmed our herd. They will be taking more responsibility for farrier duties in 2021.

### Horsemanship and Equitation

During full-team trainings and on administrative days, the team continued to train under Kelly Messera where we continued to work on our horsemanship skills. We also worked the horses to make them more confident and comfortable in their roles.

The team tired something new this year; Black Max. This simulation horse monitors all sorts of rider aspects such as seat, leg pressure, posting balance etc. The simulator responds to you while showing ,in real time, how you are doing. This was extremely beneficial as each rider saw what they did well and what they need to improve on. We will continue to use this training opportunity in the off-season and into 2021.
