

## Types of Force Used By Officers

From January 1st through March 31st of 2016, Madison Police Officers responded to over 47,400 calls for service. In that time, there were 56 citizen contacts in which officers used some kind of force during their encounter. This means that in the 1st quarter, MPD officers used force .0012% of the time when engaging with our citizens. Each of these force incidents documented by officers was reviewed and determined to be within MPD standard operating procedures.
