On October 9th, MSC held its annual Health and Resource Fair. Over 80 participants came to learn about maintaining and improving their health. Attendees could visit any of the 34 exhibitors that serve older adults and help them to age in place successfully.

We also had screenings available for participants to evaluate an array of health and longevity related measures. The UW School of Social Work performed depression and stress tests, Aging and Disability Resource Center conducted memory screenings, and Apex Chiropractic held neurological assessments.

After participants had some time to stop at exhibitor booths, everyone was directed upstairs to hear the keynote speaker, Robert McGrath give keynote entitled "Thriving at Any Age: Guidelines for Living a Happy and Healthy Life."

MSC has been busy connecting with community groups throughout Madison. Recently, MSC collaborated with the YWCA to work on developing programs that benefit older adult women and families, living at the downtown location. MSC staff presented an informative session at the YWCA about the programs and activities we offer and served ice cream to YWCA residents.

The YWCA generously chose the Senior Center for their community outreach project and painted our entire upstairs.

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Environmental Stewardship

Honey bees—wild and domestic—perform about 80 percent of all pollination worldwide. A single bee colony can pollinate 300 million flowers each day. Seventy out of the top 100 human food crops—which supply about 90 percent of the world's nutrition—are pollinated by bees.

Between 1947 and 2005, the number of honeybees in the United States declined by over 40 percent, from 5.9 million to 2.4 million.

The Madison Senior Center shares in the global and local concern over the vital role played by honeybees in our environment and to this end, we are working towards transforming our garden and patio spaces to pollinator gardens, with the potential to include a beehive. Consulting with experts in

our local area, we are gathering information on the design and planting of appropriate pollinator plants in our spaces. Included is a photograph of a pollinator wall that we would like to incorporate on our second floor deck space, greatly enhancing the aesthetics and environmental value of our surroundings.

We are excited to move forward as responsible stewards of our space, positively impacting the environment around the honeybee population and us, as well as engaging our patrons as our partners in this worthwhile endeavor. Please donate today to help us help the environment!
